## Grampians Highlights

### Southern Grampians



#### 1. Mt Sturgeon

4 km's from Royal Mail Hotel, corner of Victoria Valley Road and Grampians Road  
Grade: Hard  
Distance: 7 km return

Mt Sturgeon is the most southern point of the Grampians National Park and a hike for an adventurer.

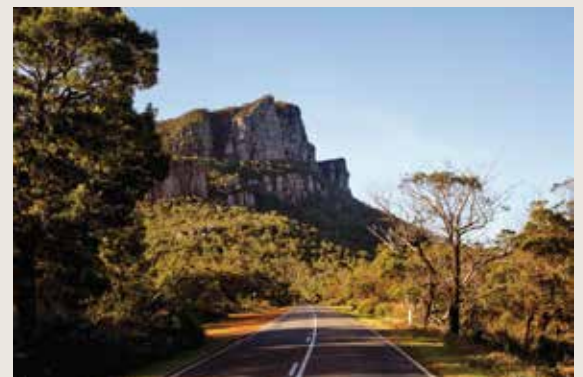
The hike includes steep inclines, rocky terrain, rock hopping, water crossings and slippery track surfaces. The summit provides panoramic views of the Southern Grampians, looking over Picanniny and Mt Abrupt.

#### 2. Mt Abrupt

6.5 km's from Royal Mail Hotel, Grampians Road  
Grade: Hard  
Distance: 6.5km return

A great hike for bird watchers, you can often see wedge-tailed eagles, nankeen kestrels and peregrine falcons. whilst walking up Mt Abrupt.

Wind up the mountain through thick bushland. At the top you can see views of the Serra Range to the north and Dunkeld to the south.



#### 3. Piccaninny

4.5 km's from Royal Mail Hotel along Grampians Road  
Grade: Easy  
Distance: 2.4 km return

Time poor? Try Picanniny.

The hike includes a gradual incline to the summit, alternating between open forest and thick bushland, with views of Dunkeld and Mt Abrupt.



# Northern Grampians

## 4. Dunkeld to Halls Gap

64 km's along Grampians Road  
Beware of wildlife  
Advised not to drive at sunset, or sunrise

Drive the scenic route through the middle of the Grampians National Park to reach the Northern Grampians township and tourist hub of Halls Gap. This drive has stunning views in every direction. Beware of wildlife on the roads.



## 5. The Pinnacle

5 km's from Halls Gap along Mount Victory Road  
Grade: Medium/Hard  
Distance: 4.2 km return

The most popular hike in the Grampians National Park, The Pinnacle offers stunning views of Halls Gap, Lake Bellfield and many other Grampian's peaks. The walk includes water crossings, rock formations and incredible flora and fauna.

Start from Sundial carpark for an easy - medium hike, or a more challenging hike from Wonderland Carpark.



## 6. MacKenzie Falls

19 km's from Halls Gap along Mount Victory Road  
Grade: 1st section – easy  
2nd section – hard  
Distance: 2 km return

One of the largest waterfalls in Victoria, MacKenzie Falls flows all year round.

Take the easy one kilometre walk to the viewing platform, or continue down the steep trail to the base of the falls.



## 7. The Balconies

13 km's from Halls Gap, Reeds Lookout Carpark, Northern Grampians Road  
Grade: Easy  
Distance: 2 km return

Walk along the rocky path to the lookout over Victoria Valley. Beautiful at sunrise and sunset, this lookout offers panoramic views.

It is an easy walk suitable for all walking abilities, providing stellar views.



## 8. Brambuk Cultural Centre

277 Grampians Road, Halls Gap  
Monday to Sunday: 9am – 5pm  
Free

Learn about the culture and history of the indigenous communities of Western Victoria. It is 100% owned and operated by Aboriginal people and is the longest running Aboriginal Cultural Centre in Australia.
